The aim is to collect as much data as possible on gallbladder cancer from around the world. This will provide insights into the demographics, diagnostics, and treatments of gallbladder cancer (GBC). All available data and expertise will be used to create uniform, clear guidelines and ultimately improve the outcomes for patients with this rare form of cancer.

Collaboration involves entering data from patients with GBC (from 2016 onward) into the joint database. All collaborators from participating centers will be granted authorship on all published articles based on this database.

Project proposals can be submitted by any collaborator. These proposals will be screened by the Steering Committee, and data will be provided if the research proposal is deemed suitable.

What's new?

First of all, we'd like to introduce you to Lusien van Santwijk, our new team member. She will be taking over the daily management of the GBC registry as a PhD candidate.

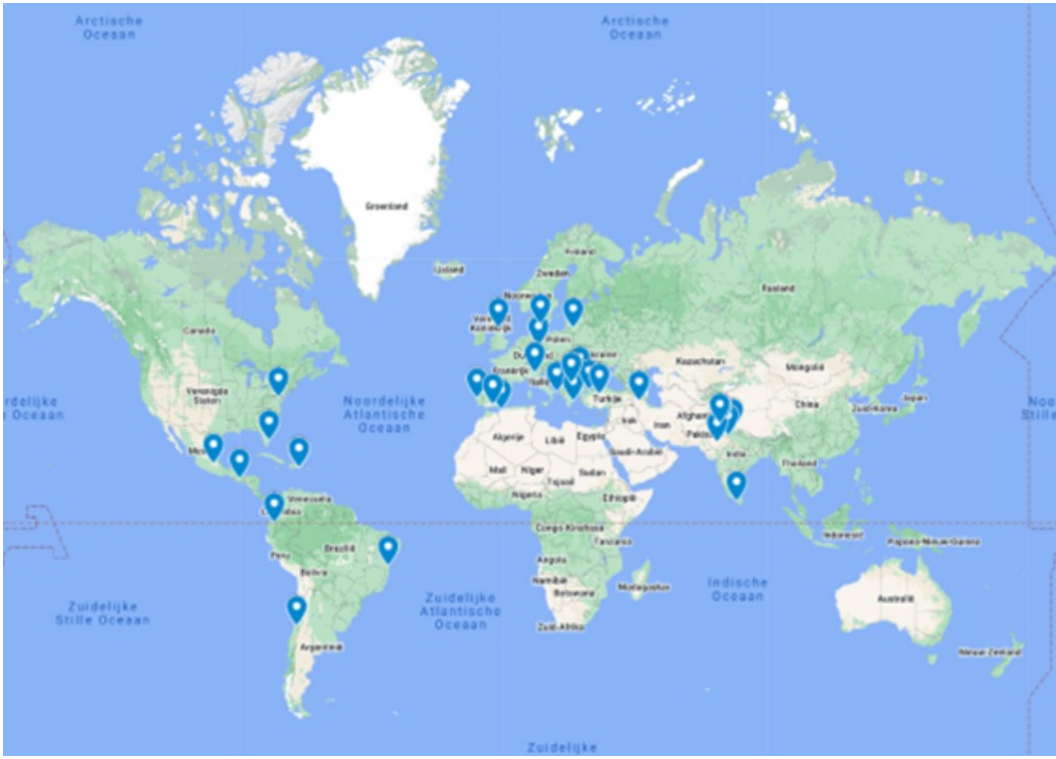
